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Abstract

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Background

- Recently published goals and objectives for Health Care
 Transition (HCT) curriculum in *Pediatrics* (2018)
 We want to help program directors implement HCT
 curriculum in their programs

Methods

- Recruited 21 med-peds programs to participate in learning collaborative

 Programs were randomly selected into two groups:

 Curriculum Development group (14)

 Learner Evaluation group (7)

 Used Breakthrough Series (8TS) methodology learning

- Used Breakthrough Series (BTS) methodology learning collaborative
 Centralized administration
 Monthly TA calls
 Baseline data, ongoing data, post-intervention data
 Timeline: July 2018 March 2019 (not including dates for post-intervention data)

Goal

Create toolkit from which program directors can pull from in order to enrich/start implementing HCT curricular activities

Data

Program self-assessments measured at 7 and 6 consecutive time points in the Curriculum and Evaluation groups, respectively
